- 1. Student Body President: Estevan Mesa
 - a. Zoom suggestions to ensure meeting security:
 - i. Enable the waiting room for all meetings
 - ii. Disable "join before host"
 - iii. Disable join as a guest and only allow registered Zoom users or users with a @columbia.edu email to join a meeting
 - iv. Require registration of attendees before sharing the zoom link
 - v. Do not share zoom links in public forums
 - vi. Disable participants ability to unmute themselves
 - vii. Disable participants ability to screen share
 - viii. Only allow host to share screen
 - ix. Disable participants ability to use the chat function
 - x. Disable annotations
 - xi. Put a passcode on all meetings

- xii. Mute all participants
- xiii. Disable using PMI (personal meeting ID) for any meetings
- xiv. Disable allow participants to rename themselves
- b. Dean Morrison meeting last week
 - i. Proctorio/similar tools can be discussed at a future COI, will send relevant articles to faculty beforehand
 - ii. Spring P/D/F: no guarantee
 - Suggests planning ahead since Spring semester will be similar to Fall semester (mentioned that some 40%+ of SEAS undergrads are taking 7+ classes in the Fall semester)
 - Might need to wait and see how it is utilized/general feedback from Fall before making decision about Spring
 - 3. Ideally, we want to have a response this semester so students can plan accordingly
 - iii. CUIT is working on the SSOL P/D/F option, please spread the word that this will be updated soon and that undergraduates can select the option until Dec. 14!
 - Note: Engineering students cannot elect to P/D/F Fall A courses.
 Only semester and Fall B courses
 - iv. Graduation
 - No plans for in-person graduation this Spring due to public health interest, but plans to host a celebration in the future similar to what they are planning for class of 2020
- c. Upcoming Dean Morrison/COI topics for discussion
 - i. Credit limit and 40-credit over three semesters
 - We previously met with Dean Morrison to ensure SEAS students could still take 21 credits in the Fall/Spring semesters, which had originally been limited to 18 for this year to make the same as CC
 - ii. Trying to get course policies included in SSOL descriptions beforehand to ensure students can plan for time zone concerns
- d. Met with Diego Largacha from International Students' Advisory Board, Egem and Angel regarding accommodations for international students and collaborating on surveying the student body regarding sacrifices they have had to make to attend class, other difficulties, etc.
