Discussion Topics

- 1. 2020-2021 (3 Term) Academic Year Policies 40 Point Credit Limit & Shortened Winter Break Duration, 7-10 mins (as necessary)
 - a. For the credit limit
 - i. Equity concerns for CC vs SEAS policies $(36 \Rightarrow 40 \text{ vs } 42 \Rightarrow 40)$
 - ii. Action items: make a survey to gauge student interest in spreading their classes over the three semesters rather than two semesters, to help our case in advocating for keeping the 42 credit limit
 - b. For the winter break
 - i. Comparison to other lvy League universities
 - ii. Virtual learning fatigue
 - iii. Even though we might not get a policy implemented, I strongly believe that we must collect data on the shortened winter break for future reference. It is important to reflect on students' well being and inform the administration about how policies are received by students. We can either include questions in our 40 point credit limit survey or Lori's mental health survey depending on our meeting with Dean Morrison. It better fits with the mental health survey; however, if the administration is willing to have a

discussion about it, we need data asap so it might be better to include it the 40 point credit limit survey and rename it to something similar to "Survey for 2020-2021 (3 Term) Academic Year Policies".
